1.	Junior Road Safety Officers .1. Pupil JRSOs presented their Safe Routes to School Travel plan. There were 160 responses to the recent questionnaire and the children had also been out surveying the drop off zone and other arrival points.	 The pupils had identified a number of issues they were going to write to Jamie Rodden in Roads about including lengthening the timing of the pedestrian phase on Kelvin Way and lorries coming into Otago Street in the morning. He would be invited for a walk around to look at how things are working one year on. The Parent Council would write about the bin lorry that picks up the school waste at 0820. The Parent Council were happy to fund some safety give aways like reflectors and other sources of these type of items could maybe be found for events.

6. School Photographs A parent had asked about whether class photographs could be taken each year. Mr Donaghy explained about the low uptake of these compared to a high volume of individual and family photos. 7. School Bell A parent had asked about the recent increase in volume of the school bell. Mr Donaghy explained that children had complained of not hearing the bell in the playground while the volume had been very loud in school. Technicians had altered the setting recently.	It was agreed that the bell probably was too loud now out in the playground and the technicians would be called again.
8. After school activities Mr Donaghy raised the wish of the school to run more after school activities. Other schools currently have about twice the number of children participating in such activities but Hillhead is very limited due to after school lets.	Alternative accommodation for after school care might need to be looked at in the future in order for the school to fulfil more activities. The main opinion was that if alternative accommodation was near the school this would cause less disruption.
