#### **National Assessments**

As you know the Scottish Government is committed to assess, using National Assessments, all children in P1, P4 and P7 to raise levels of attainment.

The National Assessments are used as part of a wider framework to check progress in literacy and numeracy. All schools use a range of assessments to monitor progress and National Assessments will offer one more way to provide the class teacher with useful diagnostic and formative information to help her/him determine the extent of the progress a child has made. The Scottish Government has placed the teacher's professional judgement at the heart of this process and the National Assessments should provide confirmation of the teacher's judgement as well as useful information that may help guide next steps in learning.

Over the next few weeks and months we will be assessing our children in P1, P4 and P7 using the National Assessments. They are administered on a laptop or iPad. We will continue to use a range of assessments at all stages of the school to help our class teachers form a very accurate picture of progress.

### **Constant Ceilidh – Fundraiser**

We went ahead with our Constant Ceilidh last Friday and the children did exceptionally well demonstrating their dancing skills in the gym and dinner hall throughout the morning. We then organised for all of the children to Ceilidh Dance round the outside of the school building. The P7s were paired with the P1s, The P6s with the P2s, and P4s with the P6s and themselves.

This section of the fundraiser worked well in the main but unfortunately we could not get the music out of one of our speakers and we had to improvise for those children in that area! We are disappointed that we had this technical hitch as we had put a lot of planning and organising into this section of the day and our children were looking forward to it. We are also disappointed as we had a lot of parents come along at short notice and wanted to let them see a very lively event. We are sorry that our plans were disrupted through technical malfunctions. We hope to produce a short film of the highlights of the day and will share this with all of you once we have completed the film edit.

The purpose of our Constant Ceilidh was to raise much needed money for our school funds. I am very pleased to say that to date we have raised £3,028.00 with more money pledged.
