# **Parking Pledge**

£2000 worth of books sold, with £1200 worth of new books coming to our school library very soon! The Pupil Council have chosen some personal favourites to be included. Well done everyone but a special thanks to Mr Thomson.

### **Social Action Initiatives**

### 1. Rice Challenge

P7 have chosen to support the "90Kg Rice Challenge" as a Social Enterprise project. This amount of rice sold would enable a Malawian Farmer to pay for a year's basic secondary education for one child. We hope to sell 360 Kg of rice which would be enough to send four children to Secondary School in Malawi for one year. A separate letter has been sent home with more details.

### 2. Reverse Advent Calendar

Last year we launched our reverse advent calendar and it proved to be a huge success resulting in us collecting 48 boxes of food, toys and toiletries, which were distributed to three local charities. We plan to have another reverse calendar this term. More details will follow but in brief every child is given a number and when his/her number coincides with the date of the month in December he/she brings in a contribution which goes into a class hamper.

By the time we get to the holidays every child in the school (and staff too) will have contributed a gift that will go to a family in need.

# 3. Pupil Led Bake Sale

A group of P7 children will be running their own charity bake sale on Friday 30 November. The children have selected three charities, one local, one national and one international. One charity relates to Social Action, another to Environment and the third is about directly helping people in our community. The children will be asking for donations of home baking from P5-P7 children in the coming weeks. The bake sale will be open to P1-P7. More details to follow.

## 4. Foodbank Collection

Our first foodbank collection this year will support a local community-led charity – Refuweegee. Refuweegee strive to ensure that people who have been forced to flee their homes arrive in Scotland to a warm welcome. We are asking for donations of toiletries – shampoo, shower gel, soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste, deodorant, sanitary and shaving items. Food items are also accepted; those with a Scottish theme are encouraged!

# **Winter Weather**

Our procedures for winter weather are as follows if there is ice or heavy snow:

- The janitors will grit and attempt to clear a path on the ramp leading down from Kelvinway
- The janitors will grit and attempt to clear a path at the Otago Street entrance
- These two entrances will be our priority due to the number of janitorial staff we have and the time available
- If the school is unable to open we will send a text message to our parents as early as
  possible. Information will also be available from Glasgow City Council's website and
  twitter, www.glasgow.gov.uk @GlasgowCC, on Hillhead Primary's twitter,
  @HillheadPrimary and from local media websites, radio and TV
- If you receive a message the school is closed please do not continue with your journey to school with your child
- In inclement weather pupils should not be sent to school unaccompanied
- Please ensure that all children are appropriately dressed for the weather
- If we have to close the school once children have arrived please arrange for your child to be collected as soon as possible
- We have a check out system in place when we have to send children home. Friends and relatives can collect children provided we have your permission
- It is essential that we have current contact details of all our parents
- Please continue to follow media reports when the school is closed. We will
  endeavour to reopen as soon as possible, once it is safe to do so

Hopefully we will not need to adopt any of these policies.
