

Some more fun activities to practise Spelling rules.

Jolly Grammar 5 and 6

Chose a Spelling rule → create a list of words → practise with some of the following activities

## Type 'Em

Type your spelling words on the computer. *Make each word have a different font.* You can even email your words to me.

## Morse Code

Use Morse Code to spell your words. It is a series of dots (1 count) and dashes (3 counts). Check out this site, <https://morsecode.world/international/morse.html> to see the international (NATO) Morse Code so you can practice!

## Secret Agent Words

Number the alphabet from 1-26. Example: a=1, b=2, c=3, d=4, etc. Then convert your words to a number code. You must write the actual spelling word next to the "code word."

## Acrostic Poem

Choose one of your spelling words. Write an acrostic poem for that word. You must also ILLUSTRATE your poem.

\*Example: Fun in the sky.  
fly Laps around clouds.  
Yes! I'm free!

## Spell-er-size!

Pretend you are a cheerleader and call out the letters of your words! Cheer up high for letters that touch the top handwriting line (ex. t and l), hands on hips for middle letters (ex. a and e), and cheer down low for low letters (Ex. y and j).

## Match-Up

Write each of your words on two different index cards. Turn all the cards face down and mix them up. Lay out your cards in rows (like Concentration) and flip over two cards at a time. Read each card aloud to see if they match. Keep them if they match or flip over and try again!

## Sign Your Words

Use sign language finger spelling to sign the spelling of your words. Check out Unity Kid's site <https://www.british-sign.co.uk/fingerspelling-alphabet-charts/> to see animated hands making the letters so you can practice!

## Riddle Me

Write a riddle for each of your spelling words. Don't forget to add the answers to your riddles.

\*Example- I cry when I am hungry. I wear diapers. I am cute and cuddly. What am I?  
\*Answer- Baby

## 30 Second Words

Write a TV commercial using all of your spelling words.

Read it to a parent or sibling!

## Code Words

Come up with a code for each letter of the alphabet. Write down your code.

\*Example: a=  b=  c= 

Then write your spelling words in code. You must write the actual spelling word next to the "code word."

## Scrabble!

Use Scrabble tiles to spell out your spelling words.

For a little extra Maths practice, figure out the point value of each of your words!
