



Geo-Zoo Phase 3 – designing and mapping out a 2D map of the zoo.


You can use as many pieces of squared paper as you like stuck together but roads must join up across each piece of paper – see below:



- Different nets have been attached with resources sent out on Monday. Some are blank and some already have buildings drawn on the faces of the shape.




- You could print out **one** net, cut it out, and then use it as a template. Trace round it to give you more that you can make.

- Fold the nets and glue together.


It is important to fold the paper accurately. Use an empty biro pen and a ruler to score the paper before you fold the paper. It will give a really good crease. Alternatively, once you have the fold in the correct place, pinch the paper and run your fingernails along the crease.


Emotional and Mental Wellbeing




